
# October 8 | New Fall & Winter Menu

#### **October Wine Specials**

From Orin Swift Cellars in California's Napa Valley.

### Orin Swift Blank Stare, Sauvignon Blanc

A glowing pale straw with a striking touch of chartreuse sits in the glass. Aromatically, the wine pops with lime zest, gooseberries, ripe passion-fruit, fresh-cut grass and lemon bars. On the entry, the acidity acts like a belt, constraining the voluntuouses.

constraining the voluptuousness; similar taste profiles to the nose plus crispy green apples and the faintest hint of fresh sage abound. The finish is reminiscent of ripe kiwi and limoncello, teetering on a beam of lingering acidity.

Pairs well with Arugula-Crusted Halibut, Cedar-Planked Salmon, and Chicken Piccata.

### Orin Swift Trigger Finger, Grenache

With a lucid ruby brick, the wine offers aromas of bright strawberry, bing cherry, white pepper and candied rhubarb, if only! On the palate, the ripe red fruits carry though along with notes of fresh black pepper, river rocks and strawberry cream. Chewy tannins close out the wine at perpetuating length with a touch of fresh raspberry.

Pairs well with U Club Prime Rib, Braveheart Filet Mignon, or Bone-In Pork Chop.
